"What's in a Name?"

"That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet." 'Romeo and Juliet,' Act II, Scene II, by William Shakespeare

Names don't change people. People redefine their names.

Mark and I spent weeks choosing our child's name before he was born. Mark liked the name 'Seth.' It was the name of the angel played by Nicholas Cage in the movie City of Angels. It's the name of Adam and Eve's third son. It seemed to fit our little peanut of a child. Seth was easy-going and forgiving. He slept through the night after about 2 months. He usually didn't mind too much being dragged to multiple worship services each weekend, crawling around on the nursery floor with Karrie, playing with cars in the pew, and flying circles around me with his space shuttle while I was preaching.

He was a thinker and planner, coming up with all sorts of ideas of things to build—a ghost busters power pack, a spaceship made out of cardboard. We would find him laughing hysterically at YouTube videos or getting sucked down the rabbit hole of video games.

Many of you were in worship or participated online when Seth gave a milestone in November. "I want you to know that I am transgender and will be using she/her pronouns." We had been discussing it since August. It had come up a few years ago. And now, it is a reality. And I can't be more proud of my child—my self-assured, kind, intelligent, sensitive daughter.

She hasn't changed who she is in this process. She still loves cars and video games. She's still designing and planning elaborate things in her head—usually while dawdling in the shower. She's still forgiving and easy-going. She still loves making music.

On January 7, we get to celebrate Our Saviour's becoming a Reconciling in Christ congregation. I am so grateful that you are as welcoming and affirming as you are. While I could have never anticipated this process and my child's transition coinciding as they have, you have no idea how blessed I feel to know that OSLC is a safe place for her to share who she is fully. Therefore, also on January 7, we will bless her new name—a name she chose, a name that suits her. Avery.

What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet. But names matter. They affirm our identity. It will be important for you to begin using Avery's chosen name and pronouns (she/her). You'll forget. You'll make mistakes. Just backtrack and try again. And if you forget, just use 'Child of God.' You can't go wrong.
